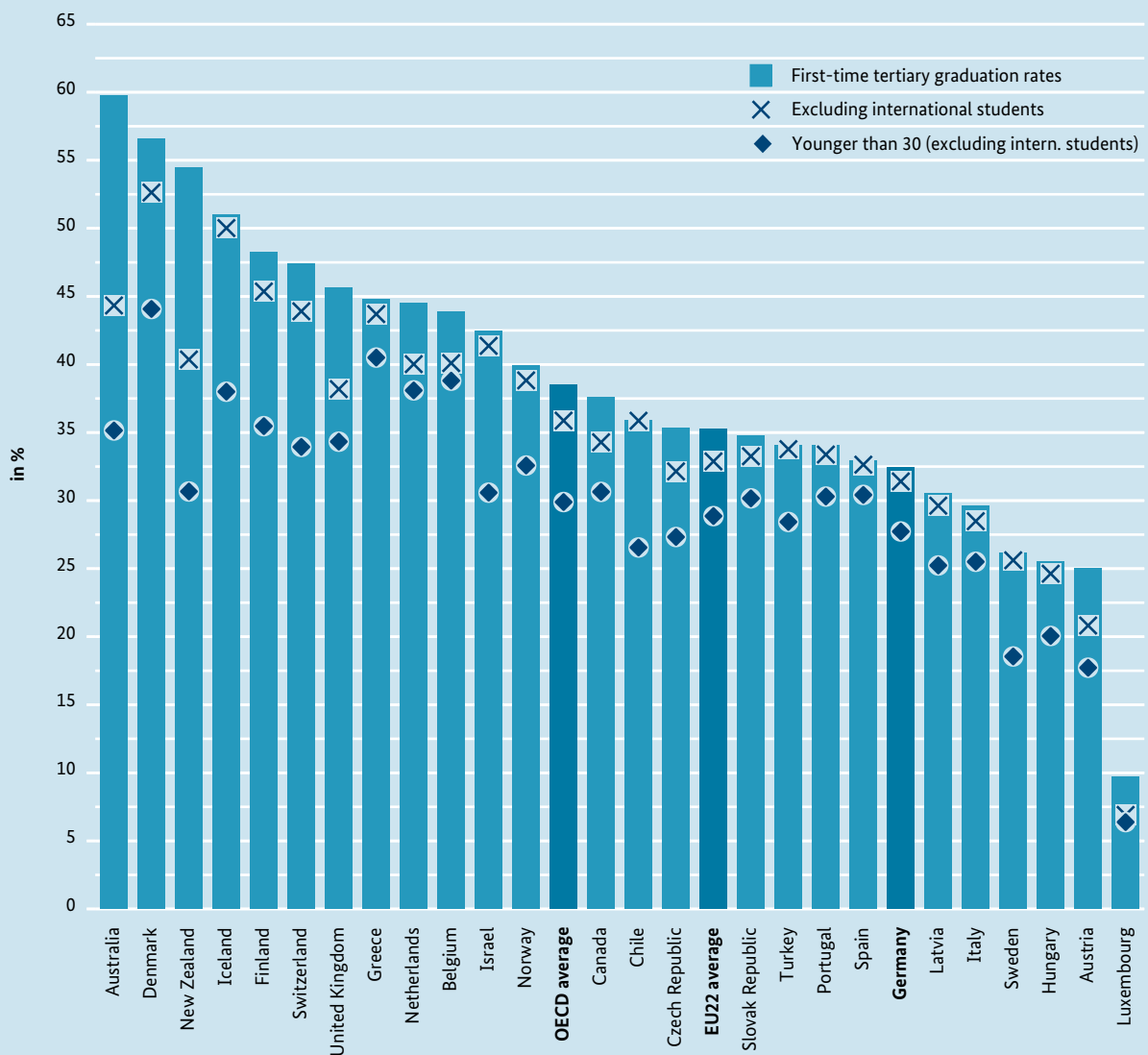


Chart 2.5.103a (2016) First-time graduation rates¹ for ISCED level 6 (bachelor's or equivalent) in selected OECD countries

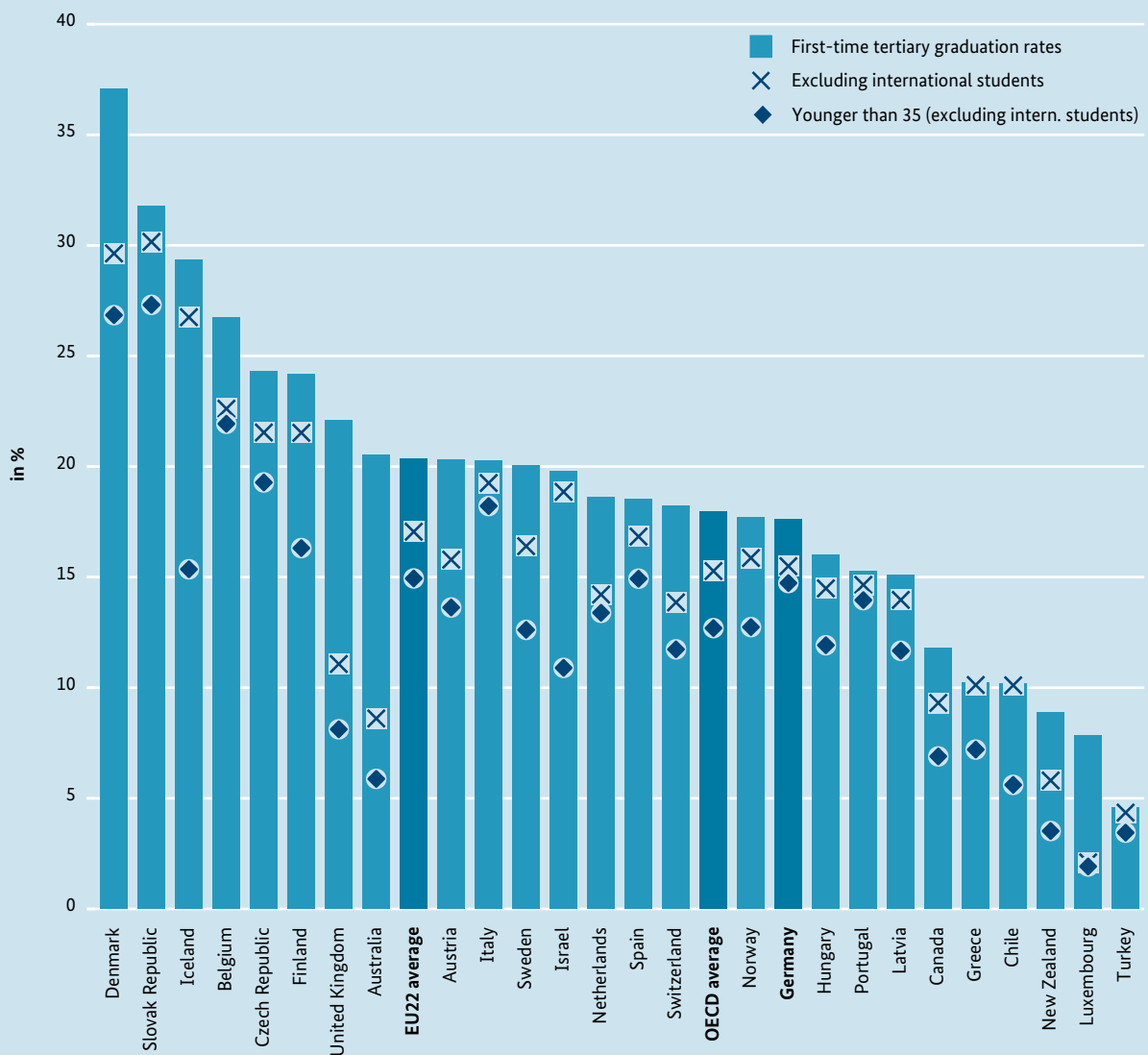
